

ROUTE FOR WHEELCHAIR, ROLLATOR AND BUGGY USERS

This route for visitors using a wheelchair, rollator or children's buggy takes in almost all parts of Centraal Museum. The mezzanines in the Stables and part of De Column are only accessible by stairs. The mezzanines are not used for every exhibition.

Please note: the levels indicated in the elevator do not correspond precisely with the number of floors in the building, as there are more levels than floors. The relevant elevator levels are therefore indicated separately in the route for wheelchair etc. users. Please be aware that some of the doors in the museum may be hard to open for wheelchair and rollator users.

EXHIBITIONS IN THE STABLES

To visit a temporary exhibition in the Stables, take the central elevator from the entrance hall to the first floor (elevator level 1). From here the route takes you to the wardrobe, beyond which a glass walkway takes you to the Stables. There is a stair lift to help you descend to the exhibition floor. Once you reach the Annex you have seen the entire temporary exhibition. From here you can head back to the stair lift at the start of the exhibition, and back to the elevator via the wardrobe. The entrance hall is on the ground floor (elevator level 0).

PERMANENT COLLECTION BUILDING

To visit the permanent collection exhibition, Collection Centraal, start from the entrance hall in the collection building. You can leave the collection building from this floor to visit Museum Cafe Centraal, or take the elevator from there to the first floor (elevator level 2) to continue your visit to Collection Centraal. From here you can also visit De Column. After visiting these rooms, return to the elevator via Collection Centraal. From here you can visit the temporary exhibition in De Verdieping, located on the second floor (elevator level 4).

Upon reaching the end of the exhibition in De Verdieping, you are returned to the central hall. Turn right to visit the Dick Bruna Studio in The Convent. You can use the central elevator to visit the other exhibition rooms in the Convent: Utrecht Lokaal on the third floor (elevator level 3) and the Utrecht Ship in the Convent basement (elevator level -1). To view the Ship, leave the elevator using the rear door. Exit via the opposite door to visit the toilets, which includes a wheelchair-accessible toilet. To exit the museum, take the central elevator to the entrance hall (elevator level 0).

TOILETS AND NAPPY ROOMS

There are three wheelchair-accessible toilets in the museum. One is in the Convent basement (elevator level -1), reachable using the elevator in the entrance hall (elevator level 0); another at the auditorium in the Stables; and one at Museum Cafe Centraal. The toilet at Museum Cafe Centraal can be reached using an elevator (elevator level -1) located behind the access gate to the museum. You can open the gate using a valid museum ticket, or you can ask a cafe worker to open the gate for you.

Nappy rooms are located in the basement (elevator level -1, from the entrance hall) and at the toilets located at Museum Cafe Centraal.

MUSEUM CAFE CENTRAAL

If you wish to visit the Museum Cafe during or after your visit, you can do so by passing through the collection building from the entrance hall, or by exiting the museum and circling the building from the outside (turn left when leaving). If you wish to return to the museum after visiting the cafe, make sure to hold on to your admission ticket.
